The Cornish Gallery of the Cornish School of Allied Arts, Seattle, is presenting an exhibit of sculptured works by Maurice Stern Aug. 24-Sept. 3. The gallery, located at 710 East Roy St., Seattle is open from noon-6 p.m. Monday through Friday. The public is invited to view the magnificent pieces of this renowned artist.

Young American conductor Richard Buckley will share conducting duties for Seattle Opera's "Of Mice and Men" with

Maestro Henry Holt. Holt will conduct the opening night performance on Sept. 16 and the performance on Sept. 18, and Buckley will lead the final four performances on Sept. 22, 24, 25, and 28. Holt leaves Seattle on Sept. 19 for a prior commitment to the Michigan Opera Theatre in Detroit.

Before coming to Seattle in 1974, Buckley was assistant conductor and chorus master of the Opera Society of Washington, D.C.; chorus master of the New York City Ballet and orchestra manager Summer Festival and the North Carolina Philharmonic on its Italian tours.

Buckley has studied under some of the best known conductors in the United States and Europe. He is also an experienced orchestra player. He earned his bachelor of music degree from the North Carolina School of the Arts, and received a master's degree in music from Catholic University in Washington, D.C.
